As a witness you have a very important responsibility, important not only to the party for whom you appear and yourself, but most important to the administration of justice, in order for the court to arrive at a just decision, all of the evidence put before it must be accurate and truthful.

Everyone involved knows your time is valuable and that you have other things to do and every attempt will be made to avoid wasting your time. There may be unavoidable delays, but you have not been

Even though you may have already given an oral or written statement, it is very important that you give your evidence in court.

You may believe that you don't know anything about the case, however, you may know something very important which may seem unimportant to you.

If you have received a subpoena to attend at court, do not ignore it as it is a court order and must be obeyed. Fallure to respond to your subpoena may result in a warrent being issued for your arrest.

Please ensure that you bring your copy of the subpoens and the original documents as indicated in the subpoens.

The following suggestions may be helpful to you in court:

- In testifying, you <u>must</u> tell the truth.
 Give your evidence clearly and speak up so that everyone in the coudroom can hear you.
 - Be polite and be serious.
- If you do not hear a question, ask that it be repeated. If you do not understand a question, ask that it be re-phrased. In answering a question, do not guess. If you do not know the enswer, say so.

 - If you cannot properly answer a question with a "Yes" or "No",
- explain your answer.
- Answer only the question you are asked.
 If you have made a mistake in enswering a question, advise the court immediately.
- Do not argue with the lawyers or the judge.
 Do not look for help to the lawyer who called you or any other. person in the courtroom in answering a question.
 - Direct your answers to the judge.

So, they are going to 31 32 call witnesses and they are going to ask -- the Crown is going to ask questions of those 33 witnesses. And once they are finished asking questions, you are going to have an 34 opportunity to cross-examine those witnesses, okay? 35 Yes. 36 THE ACCUSED: 37 38 THE COURT: So, the types of questions you are able to ask a 39 witness when you are cross-examining, you can ask them leading questions which means 40 you can put things to them and ask them whether they agree or not, or whether that in fact 41 happened. The Crown has to ask different questions. They are not allowed to ask leading

1 questions. They can't put words in their witnesses' mouth. I want to hear what the 2 witness saw and heard themselves, so they have to be the ones to provide that evidence to 3 me, okay? 4 5 So, by contrast, if you choose to at the end of this call evidence, and you don't have to, 6 once the Crown is finished their case, they are going to close their case and they are 7 going tell me they have closed their case, and then that is your opportunity to decide if 8 you are going to call evidence. You don't have to, you can just argue and rely on the fact 9 that you don't think the Crown has met their burden and proved their case. And that is 10 fine, you are entitled to do that. But, if you choose to and you want to provide evidence to 11 the Court, you can call witnesses. That can be other witnesses or it can be yourself. If you 12 choose to do that, you have to come up on the stand and you have to do it under oath or 13 affirmation. 1 And the last type of question that I want to alert you to is asking a witness to testify about 2 facts that someone else told that person for the purpose of proving those facts. So, that is 3 called hearsay and that is not allowed. That is what I said people have to testify about 4 what they saw with their own eyes and heard with their own ears. 5 6 THE ACCUSED: Yes. 7 8 THE COURT: That is what I mean, okay? 9 10 THE ACCUSED: Yeah. 11 12 THE COURT: And so, there are a number of other rules and 13 there are some exceptions to that which I am not going to get into right now because it 14 can be quite confusing.
